CV Prevention Resource for Action: Nation Review

Maury Nation

General comments:

First, and most importantly, WOW. This is an incredible amount of information distilled in language and examples that are accessible to lay audiences. Congratulations on pulling together what is certain to be a highly relevant and cited review. My comments are mostly around organization and most probably be fixed with some additional thinking around section headings. My suggestions for your consideration are:

- The sections up to the top of page 11 are incredibly rich, so much so that they are overwhelming without a little more organization. There are parts of the community violence is prevalent that discusses individual characteristics, but then there is discussion of social and structural conditions, and then a more detailed discussion about individual experiences. I'm not sure of the solution, maybe a figure that helps the reader to not experience it as a laundry list of things related to violence. Perhaps something organized through the lens of the social/structural determinants of health, which might make clearer the relations between each of the sections. Also, before the second paragraph it might be good to have a heading that lets the reader know the next few sections are going to be about understanding the prevalence and the factors influencing the prevalence of violence.
- Despite the heading at the top of page 4, the message that **community violence can be prevented** gets lost in the early sections describing the causes and related factors. You include this statement at the end of the first paragraph:

"Over the past 40 years, much has been learned about preventing violence and ways to create the conditions for health, but there is more to be learned (CDC, 2015). DVP looks forward to learning from communities and states about how this resource is being put into action and ways it can be improved so that all communities are safe, healthy, and thriving."

Perhaps somewhere in this statement you can state that among the learning is that community violence can be prevented and/or that interventions can be effective in reducing prevalence and burden of violence.

- On page 11, there is shift that seem like it warrants an additional heading. Maybe something like "considerations for developing and implementing violence prevention interventions". You then go on to discuss:
 - Community engagement
 - Use of data to inform action
 - Using comprehensive strategies/approaches
- The section starting at the bottom of page 13 you might consider a more detailed heading like "Identifying and assessing effective violence prevention program"... the section is essentially a methods section for your review. But as labeled, it is not clear. It is not until I get into it the

section that I realize it is not a continuation of the previous "considerations" section that is going to describe the importance of program evaluation for prevention programs.

- On page 55 there seems to be another shift that is not clear until you get into it section. The previous section headings were around specific strategies for prevention. However, it then goes to a section heading "Benefits Relative to Costs". It would be great if you help the reader anticipate/understand what you are shifting to with this section. It seems to be something around ways to evaluate the effectiveness of your violence prevention interventions.
- I love the structure and content of the sections on the different strategies! It is nice to have the large umbrella approach, but then share detailed examples.
- I love, love the structure of the future directions section! In fact, most of my comments are related to trying to provide a similar structure to the other sections.

I am writing to let you know that we have reached a milestone in the update and expansion of the Youth Violence Prevention Technical Package that you developed. We are at a point where we are sharing a draft with external partners for their review. We are providing the following explanation that you might find helpful: **"The Community Violence Prevention Resource for Action: A Compilation of the Best Available Evidence for Youth and Young Adults** updates and expands on the 2016, [Comprehensive Technical Package for the Prevention of Youth Violence and Associated Risk Behaviors](#), one of a suite of violence prevention resources developed by DVP over the past several years to help communities make use of the best available evidence. Previously, these resources were called "technical packages" but are now referred to as "prevention resources." The **Community Violence Prevention Resource for Action** includes a select group of strategies based on the best available evidence to help communities and states sharpen their focus on approaches with the greatest potential to reduce community violence (including the most serious forms of violence) and inequities in risk for violence."

Here's a high-level overview of what the resource includes:

- We center communities, including youth and young people and those with lived experience, throughout the resource.
- We emphasize the social and structural inequities that drive risk for violence, particularly for racial and ethnic minority groups.
- We have new guidance about correcting harmful narratives and avoiding stigmatizing language.
- We reviewed the latest evidence on the examples that were in the 2016 Youth Violence Technical Package and updated the summaries and evidence descriptions as needed.
- We added new examples and expanded the emphasis on the potential to advance equity.

We hosted a webinar yesterday with external partners who expressed interest in reviewing the draft resource. The partners include a mix of practitioners, researchers, and federal colleagues. Below is the email that we sent and attached is the draft resource and the slides that we used in the webinar. We thought you might like to see the updated version and, if you have time, we welcome any suggestions that you might have. Please use the approach described in the email below to share any comments.

We acknowledge you as the authors of the 2016 YV TP on the authorship page. The CV prevention resource is the second TP to be updated. The first was the [Suicide Prevention Resource for Action \(cdc.gov\)](#) and we adapted the approach that they used to acknowledge authors across the two editions.
